ABSTRACT 2025

In 2025, a total of x facilitator trainings were conducted in Norway, resulting in 200 facilitators who have already reached at least 600 parents. In addition, 12 new trainers were certified.

ICDP Norway plays an important role in testing implementation models. In 2025, we are in the second year of the community-based project in Haugerud, funded by Sparebank Foundation. Similarly, our international projects are supported by Kavli Trust. This includes the ICDP Sharing Community and implementation support to Nepal, Tanzania and Uganda. The projects are of important both strategically and financially.

Key activities in 2025:

- ICDP Norway has been an active part of a strong parental engagement initiative in Haugerud, developed in collaboration with partners in the local community project.
- Collaboration with Trosterud School and the initiation of a national Forum for ICDP in schools.
- ICDP Sharing Community, including webinars and implementation support to ICDP in Nepal, Tanzania and Uganda. In Tanzania an interim committee is formed and in Nepal we are developing a joint project on ICDP to parents with children with Disability.
- Facilitator trainings conducted in Bhutan, Tanzania and Ethiopia.
- Adoption of ICDP Norway's strategy for 2025–2030.
- Contribution to the 3rd Nordic Conference on Global Mental Health in Oslo in June 26.
- Responsibility for two ICDP adaptations:
 - **Parents of children with disabilities:** revision and piloting in three municipalities. We are developing applications for funding.
 - **ICDP in elderly care:** the third scientific articles is published. Presentation at Arendalsuka on invitation of Diakonova Haraldsplass. Development of a course on ICDP and project management at Diakonova Vocational College. Facilitator training including participants from Tromsø.
- Conducted webinars, seminars, digital forums and sent out newsletters.
- There has been an increase in voluntary engagement in working groups and tasks.
- ICDP Norway is working towards a more sustainable and diversified financial base through training assignments for the public sector, its own facilitator trainings, donor contributions and project funding.



ICDP Norway initiated and organized an afternoon event with Zemir Popovac in collaboration with the project partners in the Haugerud project, known as the #thegoodvillage.
